

9C42. REGULATIONS OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION GOVERNING ABSENCE WITHOUT PAY. Applicable text quoted as indicated. In some cases, italicized captions have been added for clarity.

9C42.1 REGULATIONS GOVERNING ABSENCE WITHOUT PAY FOR PERSONAL BUSINESS OVER THREE DAYS IN SCHOOL YEAR.

Item IV, Special Circular No. 33, 1969-1970, October 30, 1969, Subject: Application for Excuse of Absence for Personal Business for More than Three (3) Days During a School Year.

A teacher who has been excused with pay for personal business for more than three (3) days in any school year may not be paid for a fourth day or subsequent days of absence for personal business during the same school year. In such a case, the teacher should use Form [OP] 201, Application for Excuse of Absence Without Pay.

9C42.2 REGULATIONS GOVERNING ABSENCE WITHOUT PAY FOR MARRIAGE AND HONEYMOON.

Item 2, General Circular No. 13, 1963-1964, December 30, 1963, Subject: Permission to be Absent Without Pay for the Purpose of Marriage and Honeymoon.

The present regulation of the Superintendent of Schools grants permission to teachers to be excused for absence (without pay) not to exceed five school days for the purpose of marriage and honeymoon.

In view of the many requests to modify the current regulation, it was agreed to increase the number of excused days without pay for personal business from five (5) to a maximum of ten (10) days for this purpose. Such absence must be approved in advance by the principal and the assistant superintendent. Form [OP 201] ... should be used when applying for absence for marriage and honeymoon.
